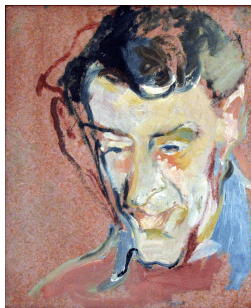

## About the Trust

The Robert Anderson Trust provides talented young students and scholars with the opportunity to spend time in London in pursuit of their studies and research, through the provision of accommodation and financial support. Priority is given to those who stand to benefit most from a visit in terms of their work and future careers.

Each year approximately 20 young men and women are accommodated for a period of one month each, in the Trust's two London houses, in the historic districts of Highgate and Kensington respectively. 22 places were awarded to students and scholars from ten countries in 2018. Our visitors are often specialists in subjects in which the Founder, Dr Anderson, was actively involved, particularly musicology, archaeology, classical history and Egyptology. Many come from countries with which Dr Anderson had particular connections, including Egypt and other countries of the Middle East, Greece, Turkey, Russia, Poland, Serbia, and Ukraine. We encourage applications from specialists in all subjects, however, and from anywhere in the world.

In addition to its one-month placements the Trust also offers accommodation and access to Dr Anderson's music room and library on a long-term basis to a student of classical music, usually for the duration of a degree programme. The current resident scholar is Jack Wong, of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama.
